

HARDSHIP FUND CRITERIA

Grants For Individuals In Need

Applications:

All recipients of hardship grants must be in **extreme social need with priority being given to children and families.**

Applications must be made on behalf of a client by a welfare agency, ie, social services, probation service, citizen's advice bureaux, victim support, health, disability and housing projects and other such organisations on the common application form (attached) adopted by a number of local trusts.

Applications are assessed twice a month. Due to the large number of applications received – you should assume that your client has not been awarded a grant if you do not receive a response within 4 weeks.

Please Note: Only 1 form per client should be submitted to Greggs Trust, as the payment will be made from the above joint funds. Only 1 payment to be made each year.

Below is a typical list of items the Trust regularly provides money for:

Washing Machine	£150 max
Cooker	£150 max
Furniture	£150 max
Fridge	£100 max

(The above amounts are for second hand/reconditioned items)

Carpets	£100 max
Decorating Materials	£100 max
Baby Equipment	£100 max
Clothing	£ 50 max
A Single Person in Need	£ 50 max
School Uniform	£ 50 max per child

Exclusions:

Payment of Debts
Holidays
Funeral expenses

Applications for the above exclusions list may be considered if the client is in exceptional social need.
